



Receiving Correspondence

Question: "I am a going to be a sophomore in high school and I want to contact some college coaches, can I email them?"

Answer: Yes, you may email them - however NCAA Division I and II coaches may not email you back. Prior to September 1st of your junior year of high school, college coaches may not send correspondence to you; whether it is email or actual mail. You may contact them, but they may not contact you as the potential student-athlete. They may send you an initial, general letter prior to that, as well as a questionnaire. The letter can basically say that they are from the University of Wherever and give you some information about the school and they can mention that they have a basketball program, but the letter most likely will not involve much more than that. Here is a general breakdown of what you may receive in regards to Recruiting Materials, broken down by the potential student-athlete's year in school.

Division I

Sophomore Year: You may receive brochures for camps and questionnaires

Junior Year: You may begin receiving September 1 of junior year

Senior Year: Any Recruiting Materials are still allowed/able to be received.

Division II

A coach may begin sending you printed recruiting materials September 1 of your junior year in high school

Division III

You may received printed material any time.
